## Animals vs. Humans

The recent killing of Cecil the lion by an American trophy hunter in Zimbabwe has renewed the debate on what we should—and shouldn't—do to preserve Africa's wildlife

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n July, hunters lured a 13-year-old lion named Cecil from a protected area in a national park in Zimbabwe. A dentist from Minnesota who had paid more than \$50,000 for the chance to kill an African lion—wounded Cecil with a crossbow. He then reportedly tracked the lion for nearly two days before fatally shooting him with a rifle.

The killing of Cecil, who was a local tourist attraction and had been studied by scientists since 2008, caused an uproar on social media and sparked outrage around the world. It also renewed
