Vocabulary and Important People
yellow- brown soil that winds carry across the North China plain and into the Huang He River
belief system based on the ideas of Kong Fuzi, focuses on society based on social harmony, respect for elders and the 5 relationships- his ideas can be found in the Analects
belief system that includes ideas such as suffering exists, suffering comes from wanting, wanting causes suffering and to stop wanted you must follow the Eight Fold Path- founded by Siddhartha Gautama
belief system popular during the Qin dynasty, believe that people acted out of self-interest and they needed strict punishments and rewards to keep an ordered society
belief system which translates to "the way" of nature, encourages people to live in harmony with nature, sacred book Tao (Dao) te(de) Ching
bow low, a sign of respect to the Chinese
westerners accused of a crime in China could be tried in their own courts instead of in Chinese courts
an area in which a foreign nations has special economic privileges
leader of the Nationalist Party, took over after the death of Dr. Sun Yatsen- fled China for Taiwan after the Communist takeover in 1949
system of government in which all people are equal and the government owns all property
spread of ideas to promote a cause or damage an opposing cause-very popular during the Cultural Revolution
Mao Zedong's policies as part of the Great Leap Forward-community in which all property is held in common, living quarters are shared and physical needs are provided for in exchange for work at assigned jobs

this is the art of flower arranging which was invented by a Buddhist monk, it designs bring the elements of nature to the "inside" of a home or office
